IN 1959, the folk music boom was spreading across the country. In Dallas, folk music enthusiasts met monthly at various homes, with the leadership and inspiration of musician and collector Hermes Nye.

A YOUNG FOLK SINGER named Lu Mitchell had the job of sending out reminder postcards to a mailing list of 60. It was Lu who suggested the formation of the Dallas Folk Music Society, whose goal was to keep alive the heritage of American folk songs.

THE 50-YEAR DALLAS TRADITION of monthly hootenannies, of sharing and performing traditional folk music, continues today. And Lu Mitchell has been singing out across the Dallas area the whole time.
